



Canine Action Project (CAP) partners with First Nations communities in Saskatchewan to create healthier, safer and balanced environments for people and their dogs. Our programs are designed to improve animal and human health, encourage responsible pet ownership, decrease negative dog to human interactions, and benefit the overall well-being and safety in Indigenous communities.

# AVAILABLE PROGRAMS

## SHARED COST SPAY/NEUTER

- Spay or neuter (dogs and cats)
- 1 dose of core vaccines
- Rabies vaccine
- Deworming
- Tattoo for identification (certain locations only)
- Pain control medication



All for one flat, low-cost rate. Owner must contact CAP to receive authorization for the program.

We do not have programs for vaccines or dewormer only.

## EMERGENCY MEDICAL FUND

Cost sharing program for unforeseen emergencies where a pet requires urgent veterinary care. The owner is responsible for getting their pet to and from the nearest available vet clinic and paying their portion of the bill in full at the time of the appointment. Owner must contact CAP prior to making an appointment with the vet.



Funds for this program are limited. One emergency per animal.

## PET FOOD PROGRAM

Dogs that are fed regularly at home maintain a healthy weight and are less likely to become a nuisance to neighboring properties by stealing other dogs' food and getting into garbage.



The Pet Food Program is meant to provide interim support to owners that may be in a temporary struggle and should not be the sole source of providing food for their pet.

CAP relies on donations for this program and food may not always be readily available.

## OFFSITE SPAY PROGRAM

CAP partners with the Western College of Veterinary Medicine in Saskatoon to spay, vaccinate, deworm and tattoo female dogs at no cost to pet owners. CAP utilizes this program for continued maintenance and ongoing support interim of a large onsite spay/neuter clinic.

This program is offered four times per year and is rotated through our partner communities.



## COMMUNITY OUTREACH & SUPPORT

CAP volunteers regularly visit its partner communities to do outreach support to provide information about our available programs, answer basic questions about animal health care, offer resources and encourage responsible pet ownership to help everyone live safely in a community with a free-roaming dog population.



## ANIMAL REHOMING

CAP assists owners with rehoming surrendered or abandoned pets by working with reputable animal rescue groups and SPCAs across western Canada. These groups provide all necessary veterinary care before placing the animal up for adoption to be rehomed. This service depends on available space within our partner rescues/SPCAs and volunteer availability to transport surrendered pets.



CAP is not animal control and will not remove dogs at large.
